



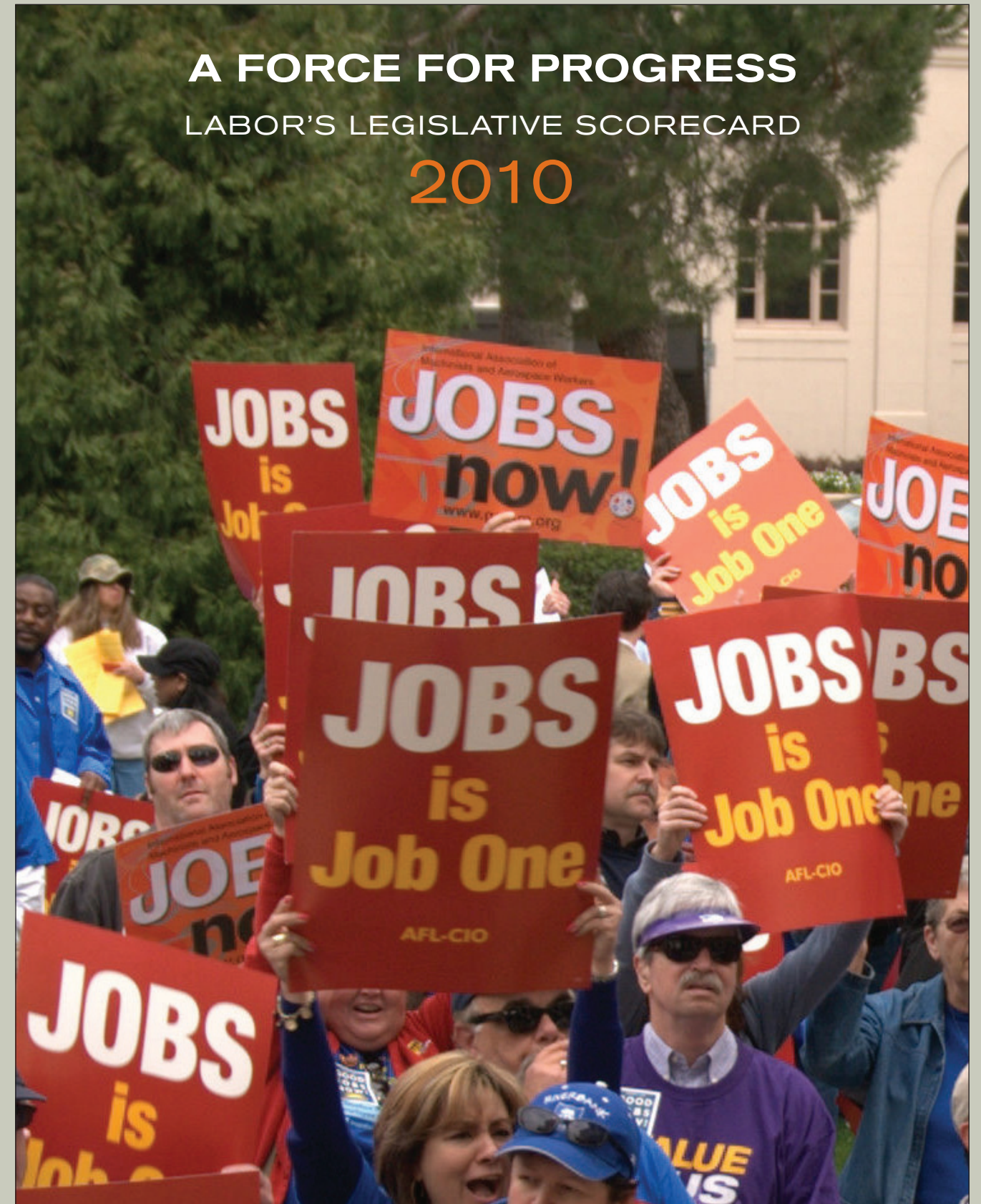

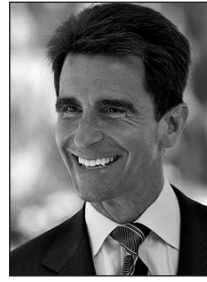

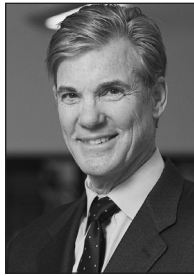

**Against the backdrop of America's worst recession in generations, California's bleak 2010 legislative session offered little help to the jobless and few answers for those in need.**

Bill after bill to shore up a shaky middle class or directly create jobs fell victim to legislative inertia, aggressive corporate lobbying and lawmakers' unwillingness to fight either one. By far, however, the chief obstacle to progress remained Governor Schwarzenegger's veto pen: 19 priority labor-supported bills reached his desk, and all but three were shot down. These vetoes, only the latest of many, confirmed his active indifference towards struggling Californians. It goes without saying that they will likely also cement his legacy as among the most anti-worker governors in state history.

As our state's unemployment rate crept to 12.5%, the second highest percentage in the nation, worker-friendly forces countered with progressive job creation legislation. One bill would have given preference to contractors creating jobs in California; another would have required our high-speed rail line to build rail cars in-state. Governor Schwarzenegger vetoed them both. Labor allied with manufacturers to craft revolving loan fund legislation that would have rewarded manufacturing employers for creating living-wage, sustainable jobs, but this was also struck down. Not even a bill to require that California tourism commercials employ California workers survived.

Other vetoes simply endorsed the irresponsible or often illegal actions of those responsible for the crisis. Employers refusing to pay a minimum wage saw legislation targeting them summarily vetoed, as did banks refusing to help borrowers avoid foreclosure.


Regarding state revenue shortfalls, Governor Schwarzenegger made crystal clear his view that budget woes were the fault of public workers. He focused on public school teachers, blaming them for the impact of billions of dollars in education cuts and even tried to push through a proposal to strip teachers of basic due process rights. Not surprisingly, his total war on public worker pensions continued, as did his drive to preserve unaffordable corporate tax breaks. Schwarzenegger rejected several bills to establish performance measures for—and otherwise improve the accountability of—these massive tax cuts.

Jerry Brown's victory over anti-worker candidate Meg Whitman gives us hope that brighter days are ahead. We look forward to working in partnership with the Brown Administration to create great jobs and bring our economy back to prosperity. Still, working families face huge challenges including a massive budget gap and continued attacks from anti-worker legislators. In the face of adversity, we'll fight harder than ever to protect California workers and ensure economic recovery.

**1. MUNICIPAL BANKRUPTCY STATE STANDARDS AB 155 (Mendoza).**

Would have established a state oversight process to prevent the abuse of municipal bankruptcy.  
**SUPPORT**

**2. LIMITS ON TEMPORARY DISABILITY BENEFITS AB 516 (Niello).**

Would have cut workers' compensation temporary disability benefits for injured workers in county jail or on work release.

**3. EXPAND PREVAILING WAGE AB 677 (Solorio).**

Would have provided for the payment of prevailing wage on power purchase agreements.

**4. FURLOUGH SERVICE CREDIT AB 1651 (De La Torre).**

Will protect furloughed local government workers from also losing retirement credit.

SENATE: 23-12 on 8/23/10

**5. NOTICE OF SCHEDULE CHANGE AB 1665 (Swanson).**

Would have clarified that schedule changes are within the scope of bargaining.  
**SUPPORT**

ASSEMBLY: 49-28 on 6/3/2010  
SENATE: Held in Public Employment and Retirement Committee

**6. STOP WAGE CUTS FOR STATE EMPLOYEES AB 1699 (Hernandez).**

Would have prevented state workers from having wages cut to the minimum wage if no budget was in place.  
**SUPPORT**

ASSEMBLY: 54-19 on 6/3/2010  
SENATE: Failed on Senate floor

**7. LEAVE OF ABSENCE FOR PUBLIC SERVICE AB 1712 (Furutani).**

Would have required districts to grant a leave of absence to any classified school employee elected to the Legislature as they do to K-12 and community college faculty.  
**SUPPORT / VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR**

ASSEMBLY: 49-24 on 5/13/2010  
SENATE: 22-12 on 8/17/2010

**8. MAKE CALIFORNIA COMMERCIALS IN CALIFORNIA AB 1778 (Lieu).**

Would have required that commercials made using taxpayer funds to promote California industries be made in California.  
**SUPPORT / VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR**

ASSEMBLY: 47-19 on 5/24/2010  
SENATE: 24-12 on 8/23/2010

**9. WEAKENING SCHOOL HEALTH CARE STANDARDS AB 1802 (Hall).**

Would have asked school employees with no medical training to administer dangerous and potentially fatal medications to students in need of medical attention.  
**OPPOSE**

ASSEMBLY: Failed in Business & Professions Committee

**10. BETTER SERVICES FOR LAID-OFF WORKERS AB 1827 (Arambula).**

Would improve services to laid-off workers by having skilled UI workers in one-stop centers.  
**SUPPORT**

ASSEMBLY: 57-16 on 6/3/2010  
SENATE: Held in Appropriations Committee

**11. BUILD HIGH-SPEED RAIL CARS IN CALIFORNIA AB 1830 (Jones).**

Would have required that efforts be made to build high-speed rail cars in California.  
**SUPPORT / VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR**

ASSEMBLY: 53-22 on 6/3/2010  
SENATE: 23-12 on 8/24/2010

**12. BETTER REPRESENTATION ON CALSTRS BOARD AB 1862 (Eng).**

Would have changed retiree member on CalSTRS from appointed to elected.  
**SUPPORT / VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR**

ASSEMBLY: 50-25 on 5/13/2010  
SENATE: 23-8 on 8/20/2010

**13. INCREASED PENALTIES FOR MINIMUM WAGE VIOLATION AB 1881 (Monning).**

Would have increased the amount of liquidated damages that may be awarded to an employee to twice the amount of the wages unlawfully unpaid, plus interest.  
**SUPPORT / VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR**

ASSEMBLY: 48-27 on 5/13/2010  
SENATE: 21-15 on 8/24/2010

**14. TRANSPARENCY IN STATE CONTRACTING AB 1899 (Eng).**

Would have increased transparency in state contracting costs and practices.  
**SUPPORT / VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR**

ASSEMBLY: 49-27 on 6/3/2010  
SENATE: 23-12 on 8/23/2010

**AB 1982 (Ammiano).** Would have put a cap on new charter schools to ensure effectiveness. **SUPPORT**

**16. PROTECTING NURSES AB 1994 (Skinner).**

Would have created a workers compensation presumption that the MRSA virus, swine flu and lift injuries are job-related for nurses. **SUPPORT**

**17. INCREASED ACCESS TO TRAINING FOR**

**LAI-D-OFF WORKERS AB 2058 (Block).** Will make it easier for laid-off workers to access training and education without losing unemployment benefits.

**SUPPORT / SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR**

ASSEMBLY: 58-19 on 6/3/2010

SENATE: 24-8 on 8/20/2010

**18. CHARTER SCHOOLS AUTHORIZATION BY**

**EMPLOYEES AB 2363 (Mendoza).** Would have given classified school employees the same rights as teachers to participate in the decision to form a new charter school. **SUPPORT**

ASSEMBLY: 43-31 on 4/22/2010

SENATE: Failed in Education Committee

**19. JOB CREATION LOAN FUND AB 2437**

**(V. Manual Perez).** Would have created a loan fund for manufacturing companies that gives priority to good union employers. **SUPPORT / VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR**

ASSEMBLY: 74-0 on 6/2/2010

SENATE: 23-11 on 8/24/2010

**20. REPORT ON CORPORATE TAX BREAKS**

**AB 2564 (Swanson).** Would have required a tax expenditure report be released—along with the budget—to show how much corporate tax breaks cost taxpayers. **SUPPORT / VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR**

ASSEMBLY: 71-0 on 4/29/2010

SENATE: 28-1 on 8/9/2010

**21. TAX BREAKS FOR OUT OF STATE TEMPS**

**AB 2577 (Knight).** Would have created tax breaks for companies that hire out of state temporary workers in the aerospace industry. **OPPOSE**

ASSEMBLY: Failed in Insurance Committee

**22. OVERSIGHT OF HEALTH CARE COSTS**

**AB 2578 (Jones).** Would have protected workers and employers by enacting health care rate regulation. **SUPPORT**

ASSEMBLY: 43-28 on 6/2/2010

SENATE: Failed on Senate floor on 8/31/2010

**23. PUBLIC DATABASE OF CORPORATE TAX**

**BREAK RECIPIENTS AB 2666 (Skinner).** Would have established a publicly searchable database of corporate tax breaks to show which companies benefit. **SUPPORT / VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR**

ASSEMBLY: 45-28 on 6/2/2010

SENATE: 22-14 on 8/23/2010

**24. TRACK CALL CENTER JOBS AB 2690**

**(De La Torre).** Would have tracked the movement of telecommunications call center jobs from California to other states and countries. **SUPPORT**

ASSEMBLY: Failed in Utilities and Commerce Committee

**25. OPPOSE THE COLUMBIA FREE TRADE**

**AGREEMENT AJR 27 (Torrico).** Called on Congress to refuse to ratify a free trade agreement with Colombia due to the widespread murders of trade unionists. **SUPPORT**

ASSEMBLY: 48-27 on 8/26/2010

SENATE: 22-14 on 8/24/2010

## Senate Bills

**26. WHISTLEBLOWER PROTECTION FOR UC**

**EMPLOYEES SB 650 (Yee).** Will protect employees who come forward to report abuses in the UC system from retaliation. **SUPPORT / SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR**

ASSEMBLY: 49-26 on 6/24/2010

SENATE: 23-15 on 1/28/2010

**27. DIRECT HIRING OF RURAL DOCTORS**

**SB 726 (Ashburn).** Would have improved access to healthcare by allowing hospital districts to directly hire doctors in underserved areas. **SUPPORT**

ASSEMBLY: 43-24 on 6/28/2010

SENATE: Failed in Business & Professions Committee

## Key Labor Bills

**28. SINGLE PAYER HEALTH CARE**

**SB 810 (Leno).** Would have established universal, single payer health care system in California to provide health care to all. **SUPPORT**

ASSEMBLY: Held on Assembly floor

SENATE: 22-14 on 1/28/2010

**29. PENSION ROLLBACKS SB 919**

**(Hollingsworth).** Would have eliminated secure pensions for state and local employees. **OPPOSE**

SENATE: Failed in PERS Committee

**30. ATTACK ON TEACHER RIGHTS SB 955 (Huff).**

Would have eliminated due process and seniority rights for teachers. **OPPOSE**

SENATE: Held in Senate Rules Committee

**31. CALIFORNIA JOBS FOR CALIFORNIA**

**WORKERS SB 967 (Correa).** Would have created a 5% bid preference in state contracts for goods and services to any company that agrees to hire California workers. **SUPPORT / VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR**

ASSEMBLY: 51-26 on 8/30/2010

SENATE: 23-13 on 6/2/2010

**32. WEAKENING SCHOOL HEALTH CARE**

**STANDARDS SB 1051 (Huff).** Would have allowed school districts to eliminate school health care standards and make school employees with no medical background administer diastat. **OPPOSE**

SENATE: Held in Senate Rules Committee

**33. OVERTIME PAY FOR FARMWORKERS**

**SB 1121 (Florez).** Would have given farmworkers the same right to overtime pay that nearly all other California workers have. **SUPPORT / VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR**

ASSEMBLY: 47-28 on 7/1/2010

SENATE: 23-12 on 6/3/2010

**34. SUNSET AND REVIEW OF CORPORATE TAX**

**BREAKS SB 1272 (Wolk).** Would have required that all new corporate tax breaks are subject to review and a seven year sunset. **SUPPORT / VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR**

ASSEMBLY: 47-27 on 8/23/2010

SENATE: 21-15 on 6/3/2010

**35. FORECLOSURE PROTECTION SB 1275 (Leno).**

Would have protected families in the loan modification process from having homes sold out from under them in a foreclosure sale. **SUPPORT / VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR**

ASSEMBLY: Failed on Assembly floor on 8/30/2010

SENATE: 21-12 on 6/3/2010

**36. ATTACK ON TEACHER RIGHTS SB 1285**

**(Steinberg).** Would have locked in a rigid layoff formula that keeps the most inexperienced teachers, while laying off more experienced ones. **OPPOSE**

ASSEMBLY: Held in Assembly Rules Committee

**37. DAILY OVERTIME TAKEAWAY SB 1335 (Cox).**

Would have eliminated the eight-hour day and cut worker pay by allowing employers to get workers to waive that right. **OPPOSE**

SENATE: Failed in Senate Labor Committee

**38. TAX BREAK ACCOUNTABILITY SB 1391 (Yee).**

Would have required that companies that get tax breaks to create jobs pay the money back if they lay off workers. **SUPPORT**

ASSEMBLY: 46-28 on 8/25/2010

SENATE: Failed on Senate floor on 8/31/2010

**39. APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM STANDARDS**

**SB 1397 (Corbett).** Would have strengthened the state's apprenticeship program by establishing basic guidelines for the approval or expansion of apprenticeship programs. **SUPPORT / VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR**

ASSEMBLY: 51-27 on 8/19/2010

SENATE: 21-5 on 5/28/2010

**40. FARMWORKER ORGANIZING SB 1474**

**(Steinberg).** Would have protected the right of farmworkers to organize by allowing the ALRB to grant union recognition if an employer's interference was so egregious that a fair election is impossible. **SUPPORT / VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR**

ASSEMBLY: 45-27 on 8/16/2010

SENATE: 22-11 on 6/2/2010

**41. HARMING PUBLIC EDUCATION SB x5 4**

**(Romero).** Will require the SPI to identify and punish workers at "low-performing" public schools while exempting charter schools from the same scrutiny. **OPPOSE / SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR**

ASSEMBLY: 41-27 on 1/5/2010

SENATE: 23-11 on 1/6/2010
